
- 1) Make a list of advantages and disadvantages of recycling.

Auntir by any we won't be able to do it again though because the Home Guard are busily putting barbed were along the beaches to stop the Germans, ships inventing from the sea. There are also anti-nirragit gues in the dunes to stop the planes.

Have you had a letter from Dad yet? I asked Uncle Bob if he was going to join up hat he's in a reserved occupation at the water board so he has to stop in Susses.
