Pupil Illness

Please can we remind parents to contact school to let us know that your child is unwell. Seasonal Flu

The 2020/21 flu season will be a key season in trying to increase flu vaccination uptake amongst school-aged children. The flu vaccination is the best protection against seasonal flu. Vaccination of school-aged children not only provides protection to the children themselves but for the wider communities, reducing the number of absent days from school, GP consultations and hospital admissions. This will ultimately support the wider system currently responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Intra-health will deliver the school-aged flu vaccination programme. They will provide a 100% offer to your pupils in reception to year group six and plan to visit schools across Greater Manchester to deliver the vaccination programme in the Autumn/Winter term. Intra-health will also provide catch up sessions for children who were unable to attend the first session.
