COVID update

Self-isolation guidance

We have all been working incredibly hard to support families who need to self-isolate to contain the virus locally. We have heard reports of families who have not been following the advice given by schools or by public health. This includes children who should be selfisolating going out to the shops, to play or even coming to school. This is now an offence and those who do not follow the advice are liable to a fine.

Self-isolation is about protecting others, and is the most effective way of preventing COVID-19 from spreading. It is very important that anyone who has the virus stay at home for 10 days, and those that might have been exposed to it stay at home for 14 days to limit the number of people they come into contact with. In fact, it is now a legal requirement and could result in a fine if self-isolation rules are not closely followed. This is both for those that have tested positive, and their close contacts.
