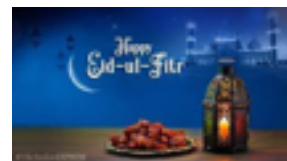

Vocabulary Parade is coming!

We wish to celebrate our love of words and reading so we are asking children to take part in a vocabulary parade on Friday the 11th of June.
(The Friday after the half term holiday)



Simply, each child will select a word that will become a costume.

- 1) **PLAN** - Think of a word '...' that would have an interesting costume design. Unusual words and words that perhaps you may not understand the meaning of would be great.
- 2) **CREATE** - You can recycle all sorts of items around your home to make a creative homemade costume: boxes, fabric, tin foil etc.
- 3) **MAKE A VOCABULARY CARD/LABEL** - Remember to make a card or sign with your chosen word on it, so we'll know which word you represent.
- 4) **COME PREPARED** - wear your costume to school on Friday the 11th of June. Each class will parade around the park and best efforts will be recognised.

Over the half term holiday and during the week after, children can plan and make their costumes. A 'Costume design sheet' is attached to this newsletter to help your child plan his/her costume alongside a vocabulary sheet if you wish to choose a word. Times Tables Rock Star winners over the last week :

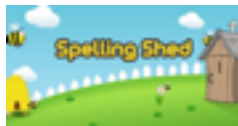
1st Place Eisha Faisal (Class 12) - 424 correct answers
